Shoebox Fun at Messy Church

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Dear friends,

We're at that time of year again! But is Christmas just about the shopping, the food, and the presents? At its heart, Christmas is all

about a God who has showed up on earth. The creator of the universe, whose hands flung stars into space, cared enough to come to earth as a tiny baby.

"The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." (John 1:14).

Every year we sing carols and retell the same story of the donkey, the innkeeper, the stable, the angels, the shepherds, the star, the wise men, and Mary and Joseph with a baby! Why do we do this? It's to remind us that God deals with the mess of our world by sending his son to die in our place. This makes it possible for us to have a relationship with God himself, Jesus Christ.

The bible tells us that rather than worrying about material things we should seek his king-dom which God is delighted to give to us. This should be the focus of our life, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Luke 12:34).

Human Rights Defender Released

You may well know that CSW subscribes to the UN mandate called FORB. The letters stand for Freedom of Religious Belief for All. This means that, although most of our work concerns the persecution of Christians, we do not limit it to Christians alone but advocate on behalf of people of other faiths who are suffering for their religious beliefs. This has involved, among other things, bringing to the attention of the world through our involvement at the UN the plight of Uigur Muslims in China, Bahais in Iran and Yasidis in Iraq and Syria.



One remarkable man who came to our attention a number of years ago was Nguyen Bac Truyen, a Hoa Hoa Buddhist who received a long prison sentence in Vietnam for his human rights work. We have been thrilled to hear that, after years of speaking up for him, he was finally released in September and sent into exile in Germany. The account of his arrest is dramatic. We let him take up the story:

"At exactly 8am on 30th July 2017 I was abducted by plain clothes public security agents while on my way to the Redemptorist Church of Saigon. They took me to Tan Son Nhat Airport at 2pm. I took the 3.30pm flight, arrived at Noi Bai Airport around 5pm and arrived at the B14 detention centre at 6pm."

Ngyuyen was held incommunicado for nine months until his trial. For six of those months he was prevented from seeing his wife and was only granted access to his lawyers two weeks before the trial began. On 5th April 2018 he was convicted of 'carrying out activities aimed at overthrowing the government,' and sentenced to eleven years imprisonment followed by three years under house arrest.

Nguyen is a human rights defender and legal expert who took on cases of individuals who were being unfairly targeted, which also made him a target for the Vietnamese authorities.

His actions exemplify what it means to love one's neighbour. While in prison he continued to stand up for what is right. This included going on hunger strike in 2019 (along with other prisoners of conscience) to protest at the ill-treatment of a fellow prisoner, a Catholic activist named Nguyen Van Hoa. On this and other occasions, there were serious concerns for Truyen's wellbeing.



Nguyen is now released and we praise God for that, but three others, Nguyen Trung Ton, Pham Van Troi and Truong Minh Duc, who were sentenced at the same time and spent years incarcerated with him, remain in prison. They need our prayers. Human rights reports by the EU, the United States, the United Nations, and human rights organisations show just how serious the violations by the Vietnamese government really are. Accompanying the reports are recommendations, warnings, and diplomatic, economic and political sanctions.

At the time of writing, Vietnamese state media has been silent on why Truyen was released before serving his full sentence. However, it appears that international advocacy played a key role, and Bui Thi Kim Phuong sincerely thanked the German government in particular for their support.

Speaking up for those who cannot speak for themselves is what CSW is all about and we continue to advocate on behalf of countless others who are still experiencing injustice at the hands of the Vietnamese authorities.

Ablaze at 3Generate



Back in October we took a group of 8 young people from Ablaze, along with 12 younger children, to 3Generate which is the annual Methodist Children's and Youth weekend away. This year it was held at the NEC in Birmingham and approximately 1500 children, young people and leaders from across the UK attended. The weekend was themed around the biblical story of Jesus feeding the 5000.

Our young people really enjoyed some of the activities that took place throughout the weekend, with rock climbing, graffiti art, the 'Journaling through the bible' seminar, the open-mic night and karaoke worship being particular highlights.

It was great to see our children, young people and leaders building relationships with each other and drawing closer to God throughout different parts of the weekend. It has been really encouraging to talk to them after the event and to be able to delve slightly deeper into some of the teaching points with them at Ablaze.



Next year, we are aiming to take a group of 10 of our young people to a week-long Christian summer festival called 'Limitless', which will take place at the Staffordshire showground. Limitless Festival was one of the festivals that sprung up to fill the gap left by Soul Survivor and this year they expect 6000 young people to join together to worship God, learn together and encounter the Holy Spirit, many for the first time.

In the run-up to Limitless our young people will be taking part in some 'Festival Fundraisers', and we'll be coming up with some fun and exciting ways of helping them to raise money to go to Limitless. In January, we'll be partnering with Alsager Community Church and Wesley Place Methodist Church to run Alpha Youth – a version of the Alpha course aimed specifically at young people which, along with offering a free meal, will allow them to explore big questions about faith and discuss beliefs in a non-judgmental environment.

We hope that many of the young people Sam has connected with through RE lessons, and The Space will come along to this to explore what Christians believe, as well as to make new friends and have fun.

Please pray that many young people will come to Alpha Youth, and pray for the leaders as they plan and prepare for it to start on the 18th of January!




Sam in Alsager High School

But first, I would like to share what we have been up to recently. In October half term, we held a Family Fun Afternoon with a bouncy castle, lots of games and craft activities. It was very busy with around 80 children, parents and grandparents joining us. In October's Messy Church, we enjoyed outside walking tours and in KFG, we have been learning about Jesus' miracles in the New Testament. Lots of fun was had bringing Lazarus back to life!





We had a great night at our Superhero Light Party, learning about how Jesus is our Superhero and how he calls us to encourage each other by sharing his wonderful light. Children came dressed as their favourite Superhero character and enjoyed lots of themed activities, face painting and games, including a Superhero Musical Stance and a Superhero Call-out game. After the talk, we ate pizza and had a prize draw for wearing dazzling costumes. It was great to see all the children joining in the fun.









In November, we held our first Shoebox Messy Church in support of the Operation Christmas Child Campaign ran by Samaritan's Purse. Members of the church were encouraged to fill shoeboxes and to donate items prior to the event. We included soap, toothbrushes and stationary items among others to give to a child in need, in one of 120 different countries around the world. Cranberry Primary Academy and Highfields Primary School were also very generous in supporting the appeal.

At the Messy Church event, children were encouraged to make and decorate items to give to another child. God with People & Development

Report on our recent visit to IcFEM in Kenya

Several of the team members who visited the Mission last month (4th-18th October) share their thoughts on their personal highlights of the visit. It was a very intense two weeks; it took most of us a week to recover!

DEC is *Dreamland Education Centre* and DMH is *Dreamland Mission Hospital;* they're both on the Dreamland site, which you can find on Google Earth or Google Maps. Do have a look! There were also visits into the communities that are served by the Mission, where LTUs (*Local Transformation Units*) are the Mission's eyes & ears out in the wider community, sometimes 2-3 hours' drive away. We spent many hours getting out there in the Mission's ageing minibus....

From Jane Askew: From our first day's orientation with the Kenyan team, hearing about the vision and aims of the mission and the programme planned for us, to the last afternoon sharing a celebration BBQ with the same team members who had become trusted, respected, and loved friends, our visit to Kimilili was enjoyable, focussed and humbling.

For me, DEC was the highlight. On our first visit the school Scout Troup (boys & girls) welcomed us with a marching drill. It was joyous, and much appreciated by all. We visited the new boarding hostel and science lab and chatted with pupils and staff, who had great rapport. On Sunday, five people went to DEC for "church". It was the last Sunday before exams and almost the last before the long Christmas break, so it was a celebration of the year, a time of thanksgiving and prayer for all the exam candidates. It was wonderful to share the joy and exuberance of African worship again.

After church we visited the (boys') Scout camp on the lower field and had a conducted tour of their campsite. Their sleeping quarters were 8 feet up, on a lashed bamboo construction covered by a large tarpaulin. It had poured overnight but they had all been dry and safe, with one scout on guard throughout. The troop had already taken part in local and regional camping competitions and had just missed getting to the National finals. They hope to win next year! Their enthusiasm was infectious. Their scout leader had been a student at DEC, then trained as a teacher and returned to teach. I was so impressed by all that's going on there. it is a very special place.

From Mike Askew: Some of my highlights were; the welcome and hospitality with which we were greeted where-ever we went. The transformation of the villages we visited, including all the different crops we saw growing, the newly planted native trees flourishing and the beehives starting to be colonised by their new residents. The lessons I observed at DEC, where I was very impressed by the behaviour of the students and the rapport and mutual respect *and affection* between teachers and students. In particular: a science lesson focusing on health and hygiene, engaging for the students, and very relevant to their situation, despite the initially off-putting subject matter (water-borne diseases, and external and internal parasites, and how to prevent them!).

From Gill Bowers: My biggest highlights are; the traditional welcome and music playing at Nairobi Airport as we arrived. Being in theatre to see a cleft lip repaired. Watching Kiprop (the eye surgeon's) cataract surgery. Meeting with my sponsored student and visiting both DEC and the Khalayi nursery, which is at the Mission HQ.

From Gill Cooper: I was amazed to see how much progress had been made by the mission in the four years since our previous trip to Kimilili. There's the New Baby Unit, the new 3 storey operating theatre block under construction, the CT scanner at DMH, the hostel accommodation for boarders at DEC, the bees project in various farms out in the community and the tree planting project (over 15000 trees planted in the first year) to name a few. All this, in spite of the disruption caused by the pandemic! The only thing that stayed the same was the wonderful welcome we received from the mission staff. They are such an inspiration with their Godliness, hospitality, focus and commitment.

From Debbie Preston: I am so glad I joined the team going to Kimilili but sad it was for only the first week. To witness the amazing work of IcFEM was such a privilege. There were so many wonderful experiences - I'm not sure where to start! My fellow travellers will share their memories. One of my favourites was joining Sunday Worship at DEC. There were about 150 boarders aged 6 -14 years. Various groups gave presentations and there were testimonies which were inspiring. To worship among these young people was incredible – they were all so joyful, and their bible knowledge was awesome. They all owned paper-back bibles which were very well read. The service lasted for 2½ hours! Afterwards the scouts showed us the camp they had built and slept in the previous night – it was a wonderful creation. Do come along to our social evening on January 12th to see photos which show the camp and much more about our time.

Martin & Buff Oram: It's always such a joy to be with our Kenyan brothers and sisters again and to witness their faithful and joyous living out of the Gospel. Our greatest delight was seeing how the 5 team members who hadn't visited before were blown away and much blessed and impressed by all they saw and heard, returning to their churches as enthusiastic ambassadors for IcFEM in Kenya. We must also mention the deep impact made by Gill Cooper's whole day seminar on Mental Health Awareness which the Director, Solomon, had asked for. Around 50 people from several LTUs came and were gently and lovingly helped to understand some of the issues. Mental health isn't generally understood in many parts of the world, especially Africa; sympathy and compassion are not routinely meted out! We picked up ripples of her teaching during the following week when we visited out in the wider community. Some of the dele-gates had travelled some distance to be there and had taken back with them so much of what she shared.

The past year at Oakhanger has been a very busy with many encouraging signs of growth. The work at the new centre continues to support the mission and outreach ministry of Oakhanger.

The prayer cabin is open daily and the Community Neighbourhood Watch group continues to support a safe and



secure environment in our community and beyond. Children and families of all backgrounds and ability have shared a variety of healthy activities in the outdoors through the outreach project.
